Presient's Message, December 7, 2021

Hi Fellow orchid enthusiasts,

Greetings from Lionsgate Hospital.! I don't know whom among you are CBC listeners and if you are, you may have already heard some of this, so I apologize. Every weekend on the morning show they have a writing assignment and this is a modified version of the one I submitted - about learning new things.

I have always embraced learning new things. After high school in the 1970s I wanted to learn about art, so I took a year and went to art school. After that I went on to university to study geology, which led me from Ottawa to Calgary, where I got my PhD in structural geology. After that I was offered a Post Doctoral project to study some weird rocks In BC., those that hosted diamonds, and others that contained rare earth element deposits. While this was still in the field of geology, it was something new. These were rocks I knew nothing about, and this was before the discovery of diamonds in Canada. So I thought "Why not?" This led to a career that took me all over Canada's north, including a 4 year stint living in Yellowknife. This was followed by international work in countries such as Brazil, Guinea (West Africa) and Tanzania, where I learned a lot about other cultures, other languages, and most importantly, how good our life here in Canada really is, and how fortunate we are. When I came back from Africa, I got bitten by the orchid bug, and began learning about this most diverse plant group. It started with a grocery store phal that my husband gave me that I managed to keep alive, and rebloom, rather accidentally. My interest was heightened when we took a trip to Malaysia and visited the Orchid Garden in Kuala Lumpur, as well as a trip to West Australia one September (spring wild flower season) where I discovered the many amazing, beautiful wild orchids they had blooming there. At the end of last year my job ended, and I retired. Despite still being busy with my new role of President of the Vancouver Orchid Society, my brain must have decided to do some learning on its own, and learned how to grow a tumour. Evidence of this only started manifesting itself this fall, and, while waiting for diagnosis, I had to learn to deal with limited mobility on my left side - which, most frustratingly, included losing the ability to touch type with my left hand. I was finally diagnosed on Wednesday, and now I am learning how to be brave, and face this with as much positivity as I can while waiting for treatment. Clearly, I have had to step back from my VOS duties, and leave things in the capable hands of the executive. They have done this before ,and will do it again. However, since we are an organization that survives through the efforts of volunteers, now would be a good time to let them know if you would like to step up, and lend a hand. Hopefully this will only be a short sabbatical for me, and I will see you all again in the new year. Until then, happy holidays and keep on learning about orchids! Jen
