Orchids in The Wild Tour - Spring in Yunnan, China

As you will recall our October speaker Wenging Perner mentioned eco tours to China during her presentation. The following information from the Orchid Conservation Alliance provides details on a trip to Yunnan China in April 2019. Information provided by VOS member Daniel Kwok

We are happy to announce our earliest Orchids in the Wild Trip for 2019 to Yunnan, China! This will be the OCA's fourth trip to this incredibly interesting and diverse country, and the first that will bring us to see epiphytic orchids, in addition to many lithophytic and terrestrial orchid species.

The trip starts April 16, 2019 with a meet-up in Kunming, the capital of Yunnan province. Kunming is one of the prettiest cities in China, with wonderful gardens, great restaurants, and nearby tourist attractions such as the Stone forest. You can arrange to come early or stay after the tour and visit some of these attractions. Our tour guides will be Wenqing Perner and Hong Jiang, who have led multiple trips to see the orchids of Yunnan. Hong is a professor at the Forestry Institute in Kunming, and a co-author and the photographer for the stunning book "The Wild Orchids of Yunnan." He is probably the foremost expert on the orchids of this province; needless to say, he knows where the orchids are! Wenqing and her late husband Holger Perner led innumerable botanizing trips throughout China. Wenqing is not only a superb tour organizer and orchid expert, she is also fluent in Mandarin, Japanese, English and German!

The itinerary takes us to subtropical western Yunnan, where we will visit natural parks and reserves that should contain flowering Dendrobium, Eria, Pleione, Calanthe, Chiloschista, Oberonia, Gastrochilus, and Vandopsis species and potentially the very rare Paphiopedilum armeniacum. We should also see some great birds, including hornbills; view rhododendrons, which should be in peak bloom; and experience the fascinating indigenous Bai and Yi ethnic cultures. At the beginning of the tour we will have the opportunity to visit the ancient city of Dali, renowned for its beautiful old town and great shopping opportunities. We will also enjoy the cuisine of Yunnan, which includes plenty of vegetarian options. The tour ends April 27 in Kunming.

There are only 14 spaces on the trip, so don't delay in sending your deposit! Tour costs will be \$4200 shared occupancy (double room) or \$4700 single occupancy and include all meals, hotels, buses, drivers, entrance to parks, internal flights, etc., but do not include airfare to and from China, nor alcoholic beverages. The deposit is \$500, and the deadline for deposit is December 1, 2018. The balance of the trip costs will be due February 1, 2019. If you are interested in additional travel in China, this can be arranged with Wenqing. All tour participants will need a Chinese visa (not included in the trip price). ****Pricing is most likely in US dollars (W.Riggs)**



T IS WITH SHOCK and great sadness that we note the passing of Holger Perner.

Dr. Perner was a world renowned German botanist and orchid specialist. He was born in Hamburg, Germany. When Holger picked some wild orchids for a wildflower bouquet, a friend of the family and local school teacher introduced him to orchids by showing the nine-year-old boy an illustrated dictionary of native plants and animals. When Holger saw the painting of a *Cypripedium calceolus*, he was hooked for life!

He studied plant ecology at the University of Giessen, near Frankfurt, finishing with a master's thesis on the soil ecology of *Orchis mascula*. In 1991, he earned his Ph.D. on the ecology of methane producing archaebacteria at the University of Hamburg. While working as a scientist at a national laboratory near Hamburg in the mid-1990s, Holger ran a research project in cooperation with Leonid Averyanov in the ecology of *Cypripedium* species in the Russian Far East.

Holger met his future wife Wenqing on an orchid trip in Sichuan, China, in 1997 (she was not involved in orchids but was translating for three orchid enthusiasts, one of them Holger). Wenqing and Holger were married in Germany in 1998 and went back to China in 2001 to work for Huanglong National Park in northern Sichuan that has one of the largest cypripedium colonies in the world. In 2003, with their home-base in the capital city of Chengdu, Sichuan, they formed a company, Hengduan Mountains Biotechnology Ltd., dedicated to plant tissue culture and orchid propagation. The company was a commercial spin-off of a governmentfunded conservation project in the biodiversity hotspot of the Hengduan Mountains which ran from 2001-2008. Hengduanbiotech, as the company is known, has gained local leadership in propagating a wide range of native Chinese orchids in vitro. A particular focus is on the Chinese slipper orchids, including the 32 native *Cypripedium* species and 24 native *Paphiopedilum* species.

It was an easy decision for Dr. Holger Perner, who was engaged for many years in orchid conservation work and a staff member of the Huanglong National Park, Sichuan, as well as technical director of Hengduanbiotech, to foster the joining of both organizations to the Orchid Seed Stores for Sustainable Use Project (OSSSU). In October 2007, Hengduanbiotech organized the technical details for the regional OSSSU Asian Workshop in Chengdu, under the patronage of the Huanglong National Park.

The Perners have two nurseries, one in the upper reaches of the Fu River valley adjacent to Huanglong National Park, and the other in the countryside on the outskirts of Chengdu on the vast Sichuan plain. Since 2010, their company has been licensed by the Chinese government to export artificially propagated orchids worldwide. Together, Holger and Wenqing travelled the world lecturing and selling the Chinese slipper orchids. Wenqing and Holger also conducted botanical study tours in the

mountains of Southwest and South China. Participants from all over the world were introduced to the orchids and general plant life as well as the local culture and cuisine. Beside these activities, the Perners continued to work for the Huanglong National Park and were involved in other projects including tissue culturing and farming blueberries and other fruits.

Holger and Wenqing taught locals to plant blueberry seedlings and in doing so, transformed the local economy of villages in the vicinity of Huanglong, Sichuan. His last project was to develop cranberries as a cash crop for the high mountain populations of Aba prefecture, and the week before his untimely death at the age of 55, was collecting and analyzing soil samples to determine suitability for this new agricultural venture.

Holger was a member of several orchid societies, judged orchids at international events, was a hybridizer, and conducted research. In the past, this research was focused on orchid ecology, and then was focused on applied reproduction biology, i.e., developing and improving in-vitro propagation techniques. He believed that both artificial propagation and preservation

of habitat and wild populations were the keys to successful conservation.

Holger was awarded the highest distinction granted to a foreigner given by the Peoples' Republic of China, the For-

r nursery eign Friendship Award, in part for his research and development in the artificial propagation of native slipper orchids.

Dr. Perner contributed to several books, including "The Genus Cypripedium; Genera Orchidacearum vol. 1; Orchids of Huanglong," and authored a book with Yi-bo Luo, Institute of Botany, Chinese Academy of Sciences, Beijing, titled "The Orchids of Huanglong." He frequently wrote articles for international orchid magazines and described several new orchid species including *Paphiopedilum vietnamense* and *Paph. hangianum*.

He is survived by his beloved family, wife Wenqing and two lovely daughters Stefanie and Isabell.

His death will be mourned throughout the orchid world, and he will be sorely missed. We will always remember his unique personality and many contributions to the field of orchids.

TRIP SUMMARY

This "Orchids in the Wild" trip to western Yunnan begins in Kunming (Yunnan Province) China on April 16 with the arrival of our trip members from various parts of the world.

We leave Kunming the next day and travel west towards the ancient city of Dali and from there to the West Cangshan mountains along the border with Myanmar, then south and further west to Tenchong, Yingjiang and Mangshi. We will visit various nature preserves and beautiful mountains along the way. Orchids we expect to see include *Pleione yunnanensis*, *Pleione aurita*, *Calanthe*, *Eria*, *Dendrobium*, *Paphiopedilum*, *Chiloschista*, *Oberonia*, *Coelogyne*, *Gastrochilis*, and *Vandopsis* species. In the Tongbiguan Nature Reserve we should also see hornbills and other unusual bird species. We return to Kunming on April 26, with flights home on April 27.

DAILY ITINERARY

April 16. Arrival in Kunming. Travelers arriving a day or two earlier may make arrangements to visit sites in and around Kunming (not included in tour pricing, but can be arranged ahead of time) Overnight in Kunming.

April 17. We begin our travels via chartered bus to the ancient city of Dali. This city lies along northwestern Yunnan's former trade route to Tibet, and is popular with Chinese tourists who come here to see how Chinese towns used to look before modernization. The town is full of old houses and the indigenous Bai and Yi (ethnic groups) populations. We will visit the beautiful old town contained within Ming Dynasty walls. Dali was at the center of the Nanzhao and Dali kingdoms, which at their peak encompassed Yunnan, Burma, Laos and Thailand. The old town was destroyed by an earthquake in 1925 but was rebuilt in its former style. Overnight in Dali.

April 18. We travel by bus to the West Cangshan mountains, where we will visit the habitats of *Holcoglossum sinicum*, *Pleione albiflora*, and several species of *Coelogyne*. Overnight in Dali.

April 19: We travel by bus from Dali to Caojian. Along the way, we will explore Zhiben mountain, visiting the habitat of *Pleione forrestii* and many gorgeous rhododendrons, which should be in peak bloom. Overnight in Caojian.

April 20: Today we explore Caojian area, where we should see *Pleione yunnanensis* and *Pleione aurita*. Overnight in Luishui.



April 21: Today we travel from Luishui to Tengchong, exploring Mt. Gaoligong. We expect to see *Calanthe, Eria* and other orchids. Overnight in Tengchong.

April 23. Today we travel from Tengchong to Yingjian, on the way exploring Tengjiang. We should see *Dendrobium, Coelogyne, Gastrochilus* and other orchids. Overnight in Yingjiang.

April 22: Today we will explore the Tengchong area, where we should observe *Gastrochilus*, *Eria* and *Dendrobium* species. Overnight in Tengchong.

April 24-25: We explore Tongbiguan Nature Reserve. This habitat has *Vandopsis, Dendrobium, Gastrochilus* and other orchids, as well as beautiful hornbills. Overnight in Yingjiang both nights.

April 26: We travel from Yingjiang to Mangshi by bus, then fly from Mangshi to Kunming. Overnight in Kunming.

April 27: End of tour, flights from Kunming to home.

Level of Activity and Accommodation

Walks in the reserves generally take 3 to 4 hours and can be on a variety of paths, some slippery and narrow, others easy and flat. Some climbing can be expected. Participants should wear good hiking shoes and walking pole(s) are highly recommended. A suggested packing list will be provided for all travelers. In general a good fitness level and open mind will be required. Bus journeys should be a maximum of 6 to 7 hours, but most of these are then followed by a few days in one locality. We will stay in comfortable and sometimes even luxurious hotels throughout the trip. The cuisine is wonderful, and there are lots of vegetarian options. Check with your physician to determine any immunizations or other precautions (e.g. medications to prevent altitude sickness). All travelers must carry a traveler's health insurance policy that includes coverage for medical evacuation.

If you would like to have a roommate to reduce costs please let us know, and we will do our best to match you with another traveler.

To ensure a spot on the tour, submit your \$500 deposit as soon as possible.

Wenqing Perner is the owner/proprietor of Hengduan Biotechnology Ltd. a Chinese-German company in Chengdu specializing in the culture of Chinese orchids, including *Cypripedium* and *Paphiopedilum* species and hybrids. She also maintains a high elevation orchid nursery in Huanglong. Wenqing and her late husband Holger have led yearly orchid and wildflower tours throughout Sichuan and Yunnan for more than a decade.



Hong Jiang, Ph.D. is a professor at the Kunming Forestry Institute and is Yunnan's leading authority on orchids. He is a coauthor of a beautifully illustrated book "The Wild Orchids of Yunnan". Hong lives in Kunming.



Mary E. Gerritsen, Ph.D. is the Chief Financial Officer of the Orchid Conservation Alliance. This will be her sixth botanic tour to China, all of them with Wenqing and her late husband Holger Perner. Mary is a former president of the San Francisco Orchid Society and the Peninsula Orchid Society (San Mateo), a member of the board of directors of The Orchid Digest, and a co-author of several orchid books including *A Compendium of Miniature Orchid Species; Masdevallias, Gems of the Orchid World; A Bay Area Guide to Orchids and Their Culture; and the American Orchid Society Guide to Orchids and Their Culture.* She lives and grows her orchids in San Mateo, CA.
