We want to keep our WCJC personnel and exhibitor safe as we start in person judging, and would like to implement the following safety precautions:

- Exhibitors who are planning to come with plants please contact WCJC Centre Chair (Abu Salleh, asalleh@telus.net). Since occupancy at venue is limited for safety, observing during judging might not be possible.
- Wearing masks while inside the venue is strongly encouraged, and please maintain safe distance from other exhibitors, judges and WCJC personnel.
- Masks, hand sanitizers and disposable gloves will be available. Contact surfaces will be wiped down
- Due to limited personnel, WCJC personnel will not be picking up or transporting plants for exhibitors for sanitary as well as anonymity reasons. Please arrange to drop off plants at the venue, or with other exhibitors.
- If you feel unwell, or are showing symptoms of COVID-19, or if you have travelled outside of Canada in the past 14 days prior to judging day, please stay home
- We are all in this together. Please help keep each other and our WCJC personnel safe.

We are hoping for a fantastic and safe restart to WCJC monthly judging in September!

President's Message, September 2021 Hello Everyone,

I hope you are having a great summer. First, I wanted to thank the August Sale Organizing Committee and all the volunteers who participated in making it a successful event. I also want to extend a special thanks to Thomas Hobbs, who let us use his greenhouse and the area around it, and to all the people who work for Thomas who moved things around and helped us set up. And thanks to all our members who came to the sale, and say sorry about the line-ups. We had no idea there was such a pent-up desire in the general public to buy orchids and had many more people come than we have ever had at an August sale, there were over 950

people who attended! We will look into having a "Members Only" line-up at future events, if crowds like that come, and thank you to the member who suggested this.

I also want to update you about upcoming meetings. Van Dusen, starting now, is open to host public events in the Floral Hall and Cedar Room, where, in pre-pandemic times, we held our monthly meetings and culture classes. There will be restrictions to the numbers allowed in, mask requirements and vaccine passport/proof of vaccination requirements, but we are going to start having in-person culture classes and meetings starting this month. We will continue to have an on-line component as well, so that people who are not fully vaccinated, and people who do not feel comfortable attending inside events or who live too far away to attend in person, can still take part. We are still working out the details on how all of this will happen, and we will update you once we have things worked out. Also, please be patient with us, there may be some technology growing-pains, as we figure out how to operate hybrid events.

Because of room attendance restrictions, there will be a pre-sign-up procedure. Only 20 people will be allowed into the Cedar Room, and we don't want you to arrive at Van Dusen to find that the room is full, so pre-booking your space for Culture Class will be very important. We will be starting the Culture Classes at 6:30 pm.

Attendance limits for the monthly meetings might not be as bad, as the room limit for the Floral Hall is 75 people, but it would be a good idea to pre-book your space anyways. We are working on how best to do this and will let you know as soon as it is sorted out.

Both Peter T. Lin and Ray Barkalow, our September and October speakers will be joining us via Cisco Webex. We will likely change the order of our meetings from the pre-pandemic format to better accommodate the new hybrid format, and will update you once the details are worked out. It is likely that we will have the doors open at 6:30, the meeting start at 7 pm and the speaker as the first item, starting at 7:15 pm.

The meeting was chaired by Andrew Wong and called to order at 7:06pm

Executive Election:

Treasurer's report:

A big thank you to members participation and keeping the society alive and active through 2020 and 2021.

Due to the pandemic our expenses, largely VanDusen rentals, are down, but we do have the new expenses of Cisco WebEx which hosts our meetings and Square to process card payments. Square is preferable to etransfer at the moment, unless we can look into making etransfers more seamless. As it stands we need two members with signing authority to sign off on each transfer.

The society will also have a credit card. This will make paying for general expenses easier, but it will be especially useful for paying foreign speakers who often prefer to be paid in USD.

All term deposits which matured this year have been rolled over.

We moved to a smaller unit at Storage Mart which will save us a considerable amount.

Margaret Prat moved to accept the treasurer's report and Wayne Riggs seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Preparing for Winter – Sasha Kubicek

Whether you have a small collection of orchids on a windowsill or sunroom or are lucky enough to have a greenhouse, September is the time when days start getting shorter and night temperatures start to drop as fall arrives. I find myself doing a big clean up of my growing space in preparation for cooler and wetter days ahead. Extra humidity trays, moisture devices are put to storage. Algae, moss, etc. that has built up over summer is scrubbed off and all dead leaves and plant material picked up. In addition to getting your growing space ready for cooler, wetter weather, extreme weather is the biggest challenge to prepare for. Looking at the news any day of the week shows that extreme weather is our new reality. More frequent and more severe winter storms will hit our coast and the potential for loosing power is great. What is your back up plan if the power goes out? For a condo or apartment maybe battery back up unit can keep a small space heater going for a short period of time till the power comes back on. Further away from the city and if you have a greenhouse or sunroom, maybe a Propane tank top heater or generator are a good back up. Always ensure you operate these with adequate ventilation and follow the manufactures safety guidelines. What I have learned the hard way is the best back up plan is useless if you don't test it! September is a great time of year to trail out your systems. The one thing we can count on is more extreme weather events are on the

way. Please be prepared for your orchids and yourselves. What better time to refresh your earthquake preparedness kits and take care of your orchids at the same time.




