Orchid Pest Management – Gabrielle Carson

Homemade 2% horticultural oil spray for bug control:

250ml water 5ml (1 tsp) Baby oil/mineral oil 2 drops dishwashing liquid

Shake well before and during application to keep the oil well mixed in the solution. Recently I have replaced some of the water with about 1/4 - 1/3 rubbing alcohol (60 – 80 ml). The alcohol helps the solution dry a bit faster after it has been sprayed on the plants.

Some of my plants had, what I think were thrips (but I cannot confirm), which kept coming back on select plants. For my catasetums that had this problem, when they went into dormancy, I scrubbed the plants down. I removed all the media, dead roots, dried sheaths, and gently scrubbed the plants with a soft toothbrush to remove remnants as best as I could. I grow them in semi-hydro so I also microwaved the leca to kill anything that could have been alive in the media. Generally speaking, I find that scrubbing plants down to be pretty helpful to remove pests - the nice thing about catasetums is that they go dormant, so it is easy to get them really clean.

Growing Paphiopedilums in hydroponic mesh pots – Sasha Kubicek

I have had good success with growing Paphiopedilum plants in hydroponic mesh pots. They come in all sizes at your local Hydroponic store. I line the bottom and sides with sphagnum moss and then put the paph inside the cavity. I then use either a perlite sphagnum or styrofoam sphagnum mix to fill in the middle. A pencil helps push down the medium to fill in the gaps between roots. The extra air circulation I find really gets better roots for my paphs and I can feel the weight of the pots easily to see how wet things are. Adding a saucer on the bottom for lower humidity situation also works well to not have the pots dry out as fast.
